Bible Giving

Every pupil receives a Bible when they start at Clipston Primary School. Reception children are presented with their Bible by Rev. Tom in a special worship assembly in church. They use this Bible throughout their time at Clipston and are then gifted it to keep, at the Year 6 Leavers' Service.



Harvest

During our Harvest worship, we say thank you to the farmers and everyone involved in the production of the food we eat. We give thanks to God for everything he provides for us. As a school, we join together as a whole school community at All Saints' Church to share the Harvest worship, led by the children. Children are encouraged to consider elements of social justice, think about others perhaps less fortunate and discuss ways in which they can make a difference to them, e.g. through charitable giving to the local Food Bank and to our link school in Karisalpatti, India.



Christmas Nativity

A Christmas Nativity is probably one of the most recognisable symbols of the Christmas season. The Nativity recreates the scene of Jesus' birth and tells of how Mary and Joseph were visited by the Shepherds and Wise Men. During Advent we light a candle each week to observe the time of waiting and preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus at Christmas.

Christmas Carol Service

During our carol service we celebrate Jesus as the 'Light of the World'. The whole school community fills the church for a joyous celebration of the birth of Christ, led by the children.



Easter Service

Our Easter service is a very special time for us. We reflect on the last week in the life of Jesus and our most important belief—that he came alive again after his death. Our traditional Lenten Cross is an integral and transformational feature of the service, which is led by the children and always wonderfully uplifting.



Leavers' Service

We celebrate the achievements of our Year 6 pupils in this special service and the contributions they have made to school life at Clipston. Children are presented with their Bibles, Memories Book and the whole school community joins together to wish them well at this pivotal time of their lives.



Other Church Services may take place at Advent, Candlemas and Pentecost and every other year, the Upper Key Stage 2 children travel to the Mother Church, Peterborough Cathedral, to take part in the Dedication Service for Church Schools in the Diocese.
