School Staff and Governors will do their best to:-

- Care for and ensure your child’s safety and happiness within our Christian community
- Enable all children to achieve their best by instilling high standards of behaviour and attitudes to learning
- Provide an enjoyable, broad, balanced curriculum and meet the individual needs of your child within the available resources
- Keep parents informed about their child’s progress and any concerns or barriers that affect their child’s behaviour and / or work
- Be welcoming and available to speak with parents at a mutually agreed time
- Keep parents informed about general school matters via communications home, newsletters, the school website and Twitter

Parents and Carers will do their best to:-

- Ensure that their child is on time (arriving by 8.50 a.m.) dressed in school uniform, with their tie, appropriate footwear and taking pride in their appearance
- Ensure that their child has eaten breakfast and has had a good night’s sleep
- Provide a healthy, well-balanced lunch or use the school’s hot meals service
- Contact the school about any concerns or issues that might affect their child’s work or behaviour, e.g. significant change in family circumstances
- Support their child with homework and other learning opportunities outside school hours
- Ensure my child reads independently and/or shares a book with an adult almost every day
- Attend parent evenings and discussions about their child’s progress
- Ensure that children attend school unless they are ill, in which case inform the school by 9.15 am
- Apply for leave of absence in good time and only in extreme circumstances
- Support my child to manage social media and electronic devices safely and respectfully
- Respect the school’s rules, policies and professional judgement of all staff
- Encourage children to lead a healthy lifestyle and apply safe practices when using social media
- Refrain from writing negative comments about the school on Facebook and other social media platforms, and instead come into school to discuss any concerns
- Make a positive contribution to school life and the wider community by supporting school events
- Ensure that their child’s address, medical needs, medication and contact details are kept up to date

Pupils will do their best to:-

- Come to school prepared (by 8.50 a.m.) and with the necessary equipment i.e. their book bag, lunch box (if required) and PE kit.
- Make a positive contribution to school life and the wider community as ambassadors to the school
- Lead a healthy lifestyle: drink plenty of water and eat fruit or vegetables only, at break-time
- Wear full uniform, including their tie
- Take pride in their work and appearance, and look after their personal belongings
- Respect our equipment and keep the school clean and tidy
- Be truthful and polite - treat others as you would like to be treated: “Be Kind ~ Be Your Best ~ Be Happy”
- Try to understand other people’s point of view and feelings
- Discuss problems with their work or relationships in school with an adult
- Make it as easy as possible for everyone to learn, and for the teacher to teach
