## National Curriculum: Geography

Pupils should develop knowledge about the world, the United Kingdom and their locality. They should understand basic subject-specific vocabulary relating to human and physical geography and begin to use geographical skills, including first-hand observation, to enhance their locational awareness.

#### Human and Physical Geography

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to:

- Key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather.
- Key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop.

#### Place knowledge

Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom.

### Geographical skills and fieldwork

Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language. Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical leatures.

**Rain gauge** An instrument that measures the volume of rain in a given amount of time.

**Shadow** A dark area caused by something blocking the light.

**Symbol** A mark that represents a feature on a map. **Thermometer** An instrument for measuring temperature.

**Temperature** A measure of how hot or cold something or somewhere is.

**Weather vane** An instrument which shows the direction of the wind.

**Atlas** A book of maps.

**Capital** city A city where the country's government is located.

**Compass** An instrument with a pointer showing the direction of magnetic north.

**Direction** An imaginary line showing the way someone or something is moving.

**Location** A particular place or position.

**Map** A picture of a place, drawn from above.

**Weather** Short-term conditions in a particular place. **Weather forecast** A map showing the weather in different places.
