Hermes



Hermes is one of the most famous Greek gods. He was a messenger for the other gods and was the only one who could cross between the land of the living and the Underworld. He was also a trickster god who liked to play pranks on the other gods.

It is thought that his name came from the Greek word “herma”. This described a pile of stones called a cairn. These were often used as markers along trails and roads to tell people where to travel. As the messenger god, Hermes would have used cairns to help him find his way.

To help him on his journey, Hermes had a pair of winged sandals and a winged cap that gave him phenomenal speed.

Hermes appears in lots of Greek myths. Perhaps nothing reveals how diverse Hermes’ believers were than the fact that he was the protector of shepherds, merchants and travellers but also the guardian of thieves.
