

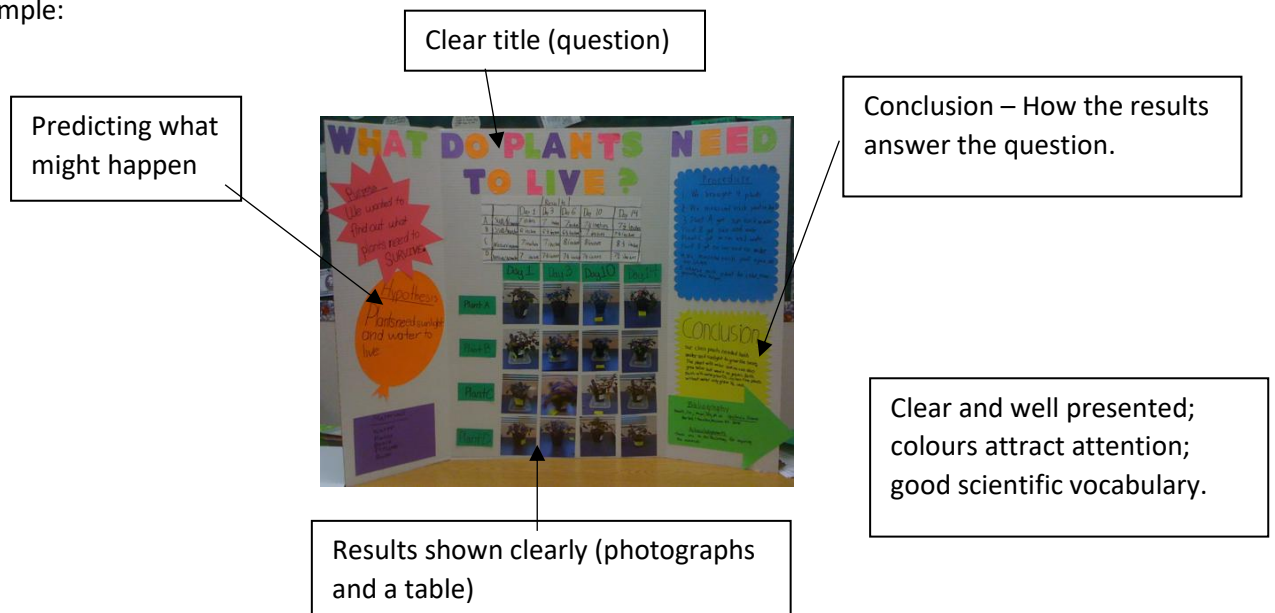


The Big Science Competition 2025

Over the Easter holidays the whole school has been invited to create an entry for the Big Science Competition 2025, **to be handed in on Wednesday 30th April**, ready for judging. The children have been introduced to this during assembly this week, where we discussed ideas and how to go about starting your project.

- Start with a scientific question or theme (If you are stuck for ideas then this website may be of some help <https://www.sciencebuddies.org/science-fair-projects/science-projects/elementary-school>.)
- Plan an investigation, or way of finding the answer to the question, and predict what you think will happen.
- Present your findings in a creative way (results).
- Clearly show the answer to the question posed (conclusion).

Example:



The project needs to be:

- Named on the back only (not visible on the front)
- **No Larger than A3**
- To be 2D (please add photos of any 3D elements)
- They may be produced with some help from the family, however the child should be able to explain their project.

The completed projects will be shared with the school, and an Infant (Owls and Robins) and Junior (Kingfishers and Woodpeckers) prize will be awarded. The winning projects will then be displayed, with all the other winners from the Market Harborough STEM Partnership, in the Market Harborough Market during the May half term week.

We are looking forward to seeing a fabulous range of creative science projects, so get investigating!
